<ul> <li>ASL I serves as an introduction to standard vocabulary and grammar to produce basic communication.</li> <li>Students at this level should be able to recite, recombine and create in ASL.</li> <li>Students will be able to develop benchmark proficiency at the novice high level in signing and interpretation.</li> <li>Students will create individual/pair projects, dialogs, and short presentations in ASL to demonstrate proficiency</li> <li>Students should expect to complete 15-30 minutes of homework a day which may include (but are not limited to): vocabulary and grammar activities, projects, and production assignments</li> <li>Students are required to sit for presentational, interpersonal and interpretive final assessments</li> <li>Prerequisite: N/A</li> <li>No GPA bump</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>ASL 2 serves primarily to expand vocabulary and communicative accuracy for intermediate-low language learners</li> <li>Students at this level should be able to recombine and create in ASL with ease</li> <li>Students will be able to interpret and sign at the benchmark proficiency of intermediate-low level.</li> <li>Students will create and present timed individual/pair projects and dialogs in ASL to demonstrate proficiency</li> <li>Students should expect to complete 15-30 minutes of homework a day which may include (but are not limited to): comprehension, vocabulary and grammar activities, projects, and production assignments</li> <li>Students are required to sit for presentational, interpersonal and interpretive final assessments</li> <li>Prerequisite: successful completion of ASL I</li> <li>No GPA bump</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>ASL 3 serves to expand vocabulary and communicative accuracy for intermediate-mid language learners</li> <li>Students at this level should be able to create and provide relevant details in ASL on a broad-range of topics.</li> <li>Students will be able to interpret and sign at the benchmark proficiency of intermediate-mid level.</li> <li>Students will create and present timed individual/pair projects and dialogs in ASL to demonstrate proficiency</li> <li>Students should expect to complete 30 minutes of homework a day which may include (but are not limited to): comprehension, vocabulary and grammar activities, projects, and production assignments.</li> <li>Students are required to sit for presentational, interpersonal and interpretive final assessments</li> <li>Prerequisite: successful completion of ASL 2</li> <li>No GPA bump</li> </ul>

ASL 4 Honors	ASL 4 Dual Enrollment
<ul> <li>ASL 4 serves to expand vocabulary and communicative accuracy for advanced language learners</li> <li>This course is taught exclusively in ASL.</li> <li>Students are expected to communicate exclusively in ASL.</li> <li>Students at this level should be able to create, narrate, and analyze a broad-range of topics in coherent ASL with ease</li> <li>Students will be able to interpret and sign advanced communications to develop advanced proficiency in ASL.</li> <li>Students will create and present timed individual/pair projects, dialogues, and ASL presentations to demonstrate proficiency</li> <li>Students should expect to complete 15-30 minutes of homework a day which may include (but are not limited to): language comprehension, vocabulary and grammar activities, projects, and production assignments.</li> <li>Students are required to sit for presentational, interpersonal and interpretive final assessments</li> <li>Prerequisite: successful completion of ASL 3</li> <li>.5 GPA bump</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>ASL4 DE is equivalent to the third and fourth semesters of a college course in the ASL language.</li> <li>This course is taught exclusively in ASL.</li> <li>Students are expected to communicate exclusively in ASL.</li> <li>Students will achieve a level of signing proficiency that would be comprehensible to a non-sympathetic native signer.</li> <li>Students will expand their interpersonal and presentational communication skills in ASL through daily signed interactions, and timed presentations.</li> <li>Students will understand native ASL signers in various contexts, reflecting the diverse aspects of Deaf culture.</li> <li>Students should expect to complete 15-30 minutes of homework a day which may include (but are not limited to): language comprehension, vocabulary and grammar activities, projects, and production assignments.</li> <li>Students are required to sit for presentational, interpersonal and interpretive final assessments</li> <li>Prerequisite: successful completion of ASL 3.</li> <li>1.0 GPA bump</li> </ul>
